 - Core document review

 - Future agenda (based on feedback)
- Living document
 - Update/Socialize regularly
 - Requires continual management

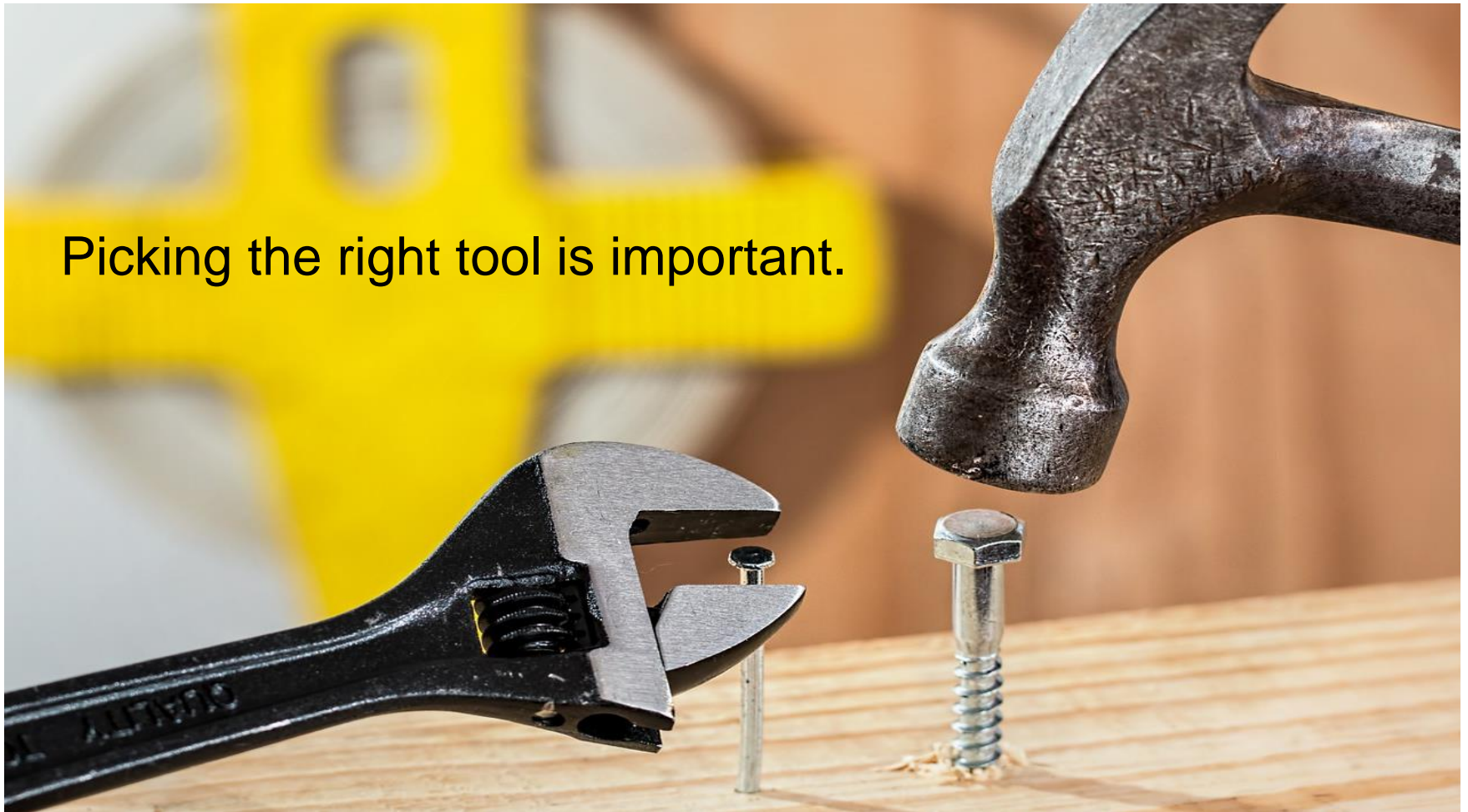


Strategic Project Example

What tool do we pilot?

Picking the right tool is important.



Piloting a tool

- We chose to pilot - Decision Lens
 - What does it do?
 - Provides a structure to analyze, prioritize and measure which investments, projects or resource utilization will yield the most value to the organization.
 - Why did we choose it?
 - Being used by the states of Washington and Ohio and has been used for many years by NH DOT (with positive results)

Tool Usage (Pilot)

- What are we doing with the tool?
 - Evaluating
 - The value it provides
 - Ability to streamline the project intake process
 - Methodology to apply criteria and ratings to projects
 - Collaborate with Stakeholders
 - Prioritize and rank projects
 - Tools to fine tune the decision making/project prioritization process

What approach are we taking? (Pilot)

Phased Approach

Phase 1: Capital budget IT projects (small scale, small team)

Phase 2: Expand (all IT Projects, core team and stakeholders)

- Apply lessons learned, explore auto project submission and evaluation, etc.
