#### 1. Welcome

Denis C. Goulet, Commissioner/CIO

### **Introduction of New Members** – Colonel Woody Groton

• Introduced Sonja Gonzales, CIO for the City of Rochester. Sonja fills the position of Representative of Municipal Government.

**Colonel Woody Groton** has resigned from his position as IT Council Chair. Woody is retiring from military service and moving on to the public sector. He will continue to be an active member in the National Guard Reserves.

# 2. Motion to accept minutes from meeting minutes

Motion was made by Roger Marchand to accept the <u>10/22/2020</u> meeting minutes. Commissioner Sheehan seconded Motion. No abstentions/discussions. Minutes accepted as written.

### 3. **Data Governance** – Michael O'Neil, Director, DoIT Agency Software Division

- DoIT has been providing technical support for Executive Branch Agencies.
- Data protection and governance has been one of the most important responsibilities that DoIT has ever undertaken.
- We have built an infrastructure that houses data, protects it, archives it, and restores it as it is needed.
- This new environment is made up of applications like Teams, Teams Sites, One Drive and SharePoint that have been proven over the years to be very successful.
- Date Governance is the exercise of authority and control
  - Roles and responsibilities data stewardship/ownership of data
  - Security and privacy of data
  - Compliance rules adherence
  - Management of data flows internal/external accessibility
  - Method and technology usage

### 4. **Cyber Security Update** – Daniel Dister, CISO

- In terms of cyber threats, you are all aware of the ransomware that attacked the Colonial Pipeline that affected the flow of oil (45% of the flow) that covers the east coast. Believe it was initiated from a phishing email, originating from a criminal group from Russia. They are continuing to target Government (state and federal) all across the country.
- Once again, training is extremely important on phishing email. It only takes one person to click on a phishing email to create a catastrophe.
- A few of the major cyber vulnerabilities over the past few months:
  - SolarWinds Orion Code Compromise in December 2020 limited exposure within the State of NH.
  - Microsoft Exchange On-Premises Vulnerability in March 2021. NH still has broad exposure to Microsoft Exchange. DoIT patches applied immediately. Vulnerability was completely mitigated.
  - Pulse Connect Security Vulnerability in April 2021. This is a secure VPN tool. NH had limited exposure within the State. Unneeded instances were removed. Fairly minor impact.
- In March, NH held the 1<sup>st</sup> Statewide Cyber Summit for local government. Over 250 attendees representing towns, counties, schools and police departments from all across the state. The Summit was sponsored in partnership with Primex.
- Cyber Liability Insurance NH has been carrying cyber insurance for 4-5 years. We are currently in the process of renewing our policy. Factors coming into play premiums are going up significantly coverage limits are being reduced.

## 5. **IT Strategic Planning Update** - Steve Kelleher, Director, Governance & Strategic Planning

- Steve provided a recap of what was discussed at last IT Council meeting
- Top 3 Agency priorities
  - 1. Program Modernization
  - 2. Improve/Upgrade Infrastructure
  - 3. Aspects of Digital Government website updates interoperability behind the scenes for certain Citizen Services.

#### Additional Agency priorities:

- Business Intelligence
- Collaboration Tools
- Security/Cybersecurity
- Document Management
- Workforce Development
- Disaster Recovery & COOP
- Strategic Plan Mission/Vision
  - Mission perspective has been on technical leadership
  - Vision perspective focused on partnership
  - Out ultimate goals is to better meet the needs of NH citizens.

## 6. **FY22/FY23 DoIT Budget Update** – Denis C. Goulet, Commissioner/CIO

- Four major areas of DoIT's budget
  - Direct budget is hardware/software, and professional services that are spent in each agency, specifically for the benefit of that agency.
  - Central IT Services & Operations is agency shared services. Microsoft 365 implementation and SalesForce.com were used heavily during COVID. Microsoft 365 and SalesForce were funded by CARES ACT funding.
  - IT Salaries and Benefits moderated by agencies removing unfunded direct positions that were not filled. DoIT also unfunded a number of positions.
  - Statewide Telecommunications budget for telephones, call center and Core state network
- DoIT Capital Budget Requests
  - Cybersecurity Program Enhancements
  - Cloud Services
  - Continuity of Operation and Disaster Planning
- IT Infrastructure Modernization Proposal utilized \$23.6M in One Time Funds for:
  - Network Continuity
  - DoIT Disaster Recovery (DR)/Continuity of Operations Planning (COOP)
  - Data Backup/Storage
